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How do you approach explaining a complex dental procedure to a patient who may not have a strong understanding of medical jargon?

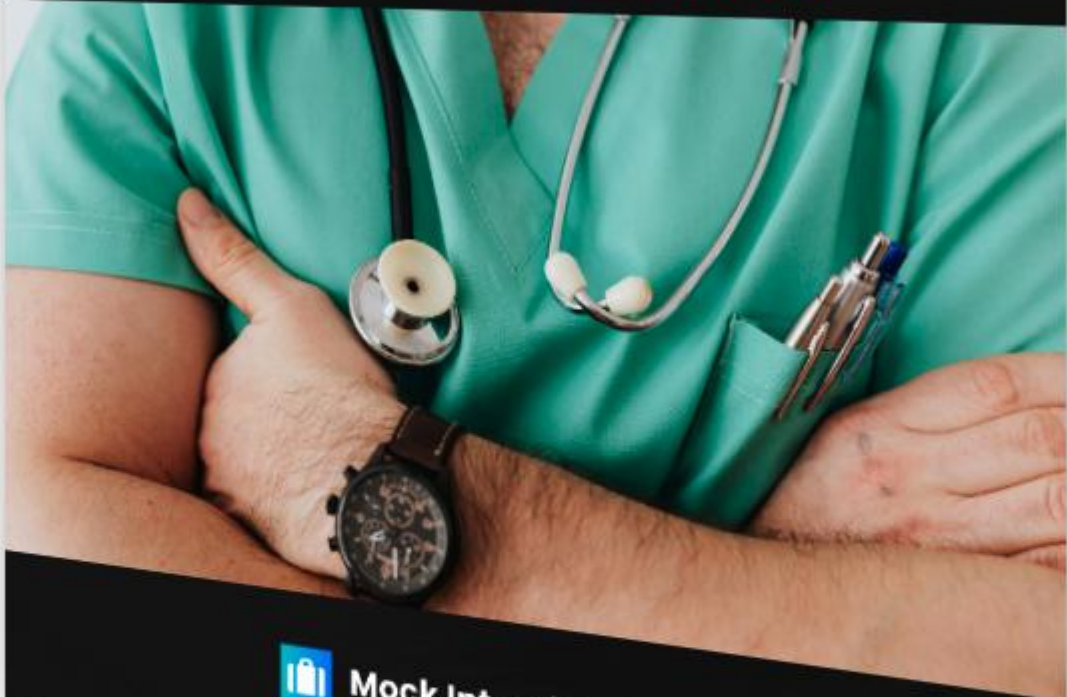

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Could you discuss a case where you had to make a critical decision regarding a patient's treatment plan? How did you arrive at that decision?

You should discuss the factors you considered, the process of arriving at the decision, and the outcome. Sample Answer

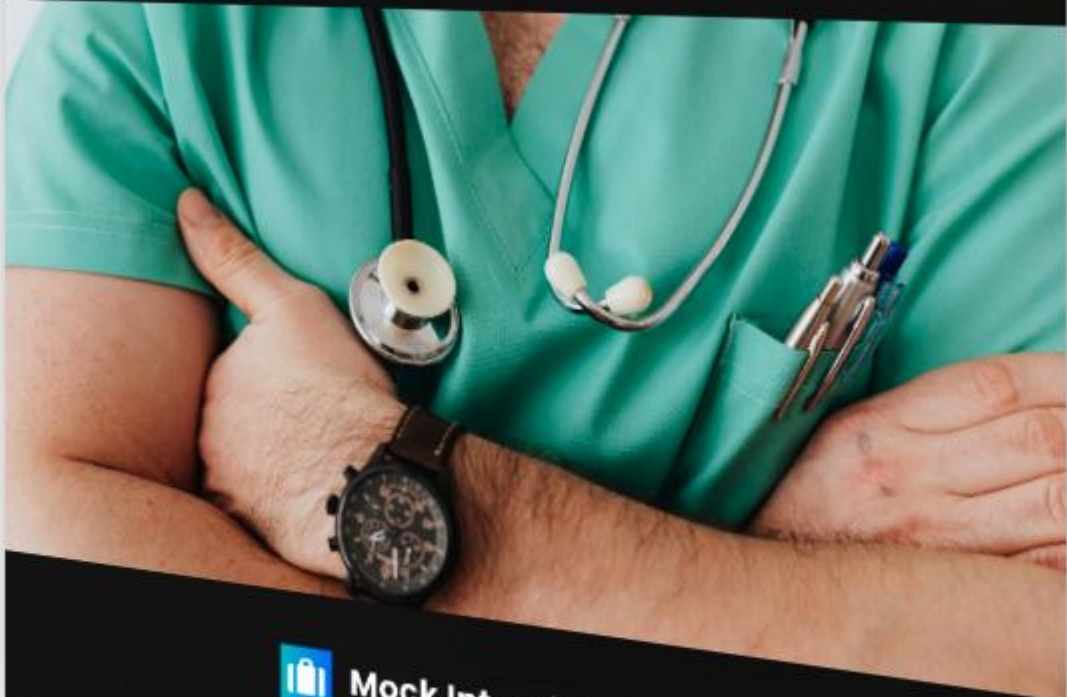
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
