What steps would you take if you arrive first on the scene of a large fire?

Can you discuss your experience with handling hazardous materials during emergencies?

How to Answer

The candidate should demonstrate their knowledge and training in handling hazardous materials. They should discuss their past experience with such situations, emphasizing the precautions and safety measures they took. They should also show their ability to cooperate with other emergency services when dealing with hazardous materials.
