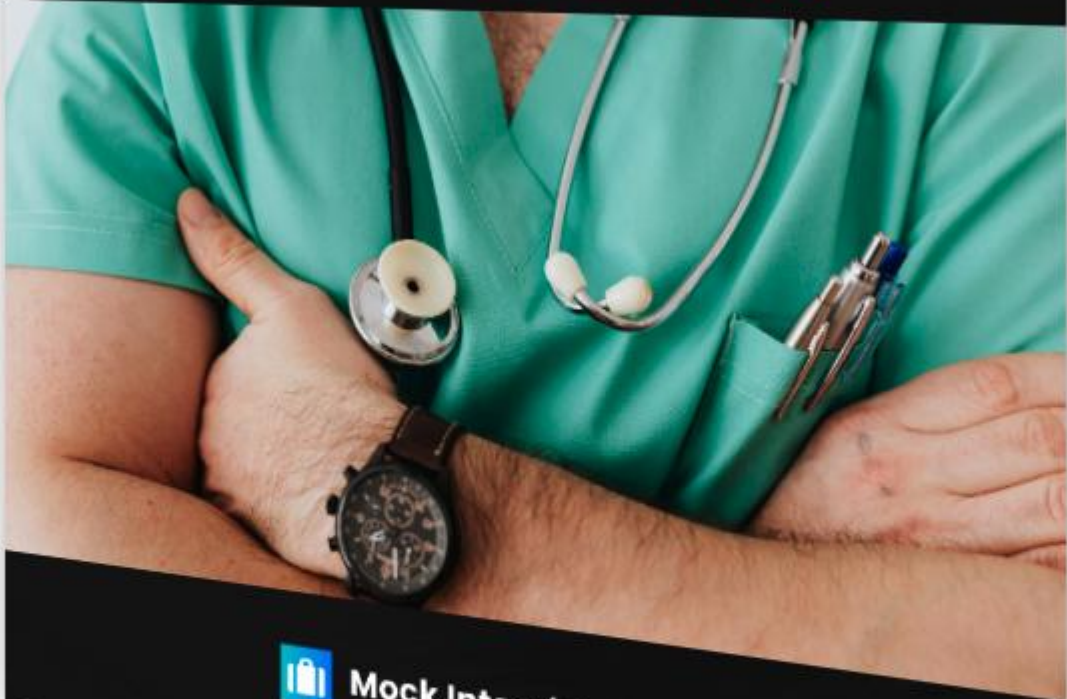
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How would you handle a situation where a patient is not following their dietary restrictions?

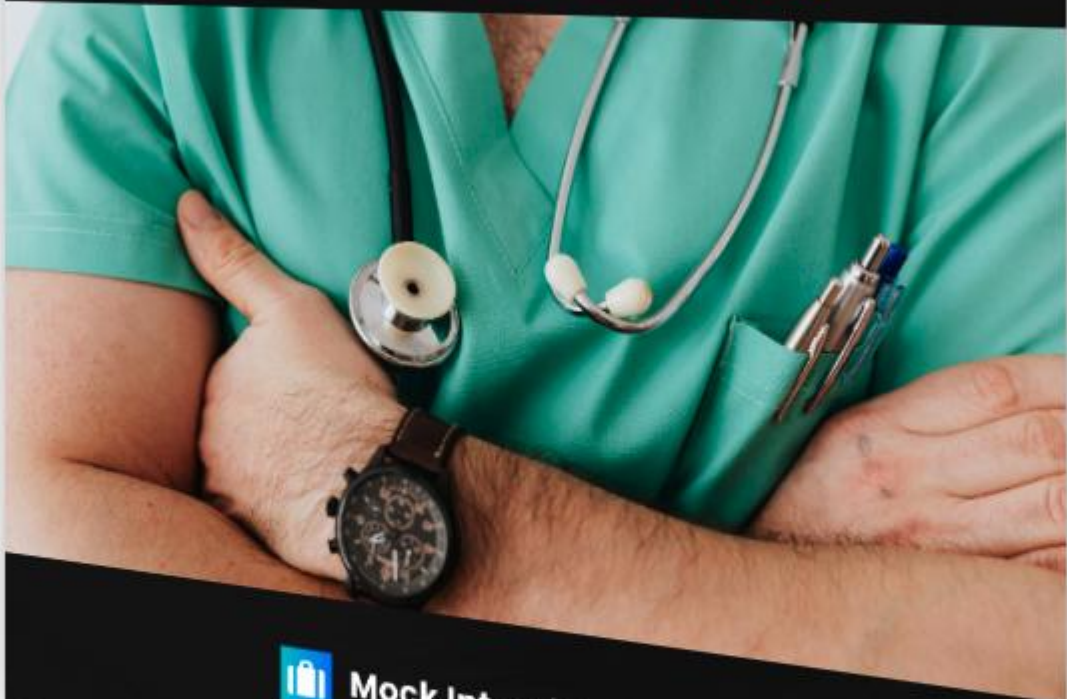
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
